As a member of the Canadian sport community acting at the national level, you can henceforth receive the assistance of a conflict resolution expert for free and at any time. This expert, a third neutral party, will help all the members involved in a dispute to resolve their conflict in an informal manner, through paths of communication and research of solutions responding to each member's needs and expectations. Moreover, this expert will explain the other options offered by the SDRCC if the attempt to resolve the conflict has not lead to an agreed settlement.
