

## **Allan J. Sattin, Q.C.**

Allan J. Sattin, Q.C., is a Calgary lawyer with the firm of Spier Harben. His practice is in the area of civil litigation. He earned his B.A. from the University of Alberta (Calgary) (1965) and his LL.B. from the University of Toronto (1969). Allan has represented plaintiffs in sports injury cases and has acted for both athletes and sports groups in carding and other legal issues. He has been involved in numerous mediation and arbitration procedures.

Allan began the study of Judo in 1965 and is currently a 5<sup>th</sup> degree black belt. He is the chief instructor at Hiro's Judo club in Calgary. His experience in the sport of Judo has included competition, teaching, administration and officiating. Allan is a Level 3 NCCP Coach and a course facilitator and evaluator under the new CBET NCCP program. Allan has served the Provincial and National Judo sports governing bodies in many capacities over many years. He has served as President of Judo Alberta (1977 - 1981), President of Judo Canada (2000 - 2002) and currently (since 2006) serves as Treasurer of Judo Canada. He has chaired the Judo organizing committees for the First Alberta Winter Games (1976), Western Canada Summer Games (1983) and National Judo Championships (1993, 1996 and 2009). Allan has represented Judo Canada at International Judo Federation meetings and events including International Judo Federation Congress, Panamerican Judo Union Congress, Pacific Rim Judo Organization Congress and the Jeux de Francophonie. He is certified as an International "B" Judo referee.

Allan's commitment to sports was recognized by the Province of Alberta in its centennial year (2005) as one of the 100 recipients of the Alberta Centennial Salute to Sport and Recreation for outstanding contribution and dedication to the development of sport and recreation in the Province.
