- **R. v. Mastop, 2010-2013** (lead prosecutor): the accused, a lawyer, was charged with participating in the activities of a criminal organization, the first such prosecution in Canada. The accused pleaded guilty just before trial and received a 2 year sentence.
- R. v. Sipes, 2008-2012: the successful prosecution of five gang members charged

with three separate murders in Vernon, B.C. in 2004-05. I was one of four senior Crown Counsel on a team of 10 prosecutors. The case ended in November 2012 after an 18 month jury trial with convictions of all accused on all of the murders.

The accused were the two directing minds of the corporation that raised money from thousands of persons in Western Canada in what turned out to be a Ponzi scheme.
- R. v. Vallee, 2015-2018 (lead prosecutor): successful prosecution after a 17 month trial of a gang hitman in a conspiracy/murder case dating from a Vancouver area gang war in 2008-09. The accused fled to Mexico in 2009 and was brought back to Canada to be prosecuted after being arrested in 2014.
- R. Alkhalil et al, 2019-2021 (lead prosecutor): prosecution of 3 accused in a
 conspiracy/murder case stemming from shooting of rival gang member in a
 Vancouver hotel in early 2012. I guided the case through pre-trial phase of
