Robert ("Bob") Wickett was called to the BC bar in 1984. From 1988-1993 Bob practiced with Russell & DuMoulin (now Fasken Martineau LLP) when he moved to MacKenzie Fujisawa LLP where he is now a senior partner, former member of its management committee and former two term managing partner.

Bob's litigation practice has been primarily in the field of commercial litigation with an emphasis on environmental, administrative, commercial leasing and commercial real estate matters. He has conducted numerous trials and appeals, not only in his preferred practice areas but also in personal injury, criminal, employment, First Nations and corporate matters.

Bob has substantial experience as an adjudicator having served as a member of the Environmental Appeal Board and Forest Appeals Commission of British Columbia since November 2003 and a member of the Oil and Gas Appeals Tribunal of British Columbia since its inception in October of 2010.
